



Breast Cancer Statistics for 2009

In Canada

- Breast cancer is the most common cancer among Canadian women.
- An estimated 1 in 9 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer in her lifetime.
- More than an estimated 22,700 Canadian women will be diagnosed with the disease and 5,400 will die of it.
- An estimated 180 Canadian men will develop breast cancer, resulting in 50 deaths.
- On average, 437 Canadian women will be diagnosed with breast cancer and 104 women will die of the disease each week.

In Alberta

- There will be an estimated 2,000 new cases of breast cancer diagnosed amongst Alberta women.
- An estimated 430 Albertan women will die of breast cancer.

Cervical Cancer Statistics for 2009

In Canada

- An estimated 1,300 Canadian women will be diagnosed with cervical cancer and 380 will die of it.

In Alberta

- An estimated 144 new cases of cervical cancer will be diagnosed amongst women in Alberta and 30 women will die from the disease.

Ovarian Cancer Statistics for 2009

In Canada

- An estimated 2,500 Canadian women will be diagnosed with ovarian cancer and 1,750 will die of it.*

In Alberta

- An estimated 160 new cases of cervical cancer will be diagnosed amongst women in Alberta and 40 women will die from the disease.

Endometrial Cancer Statistics for 2009

In Alberta

- An estimated 377 new cases of endometrial cancer are diagnosed each year in Alberta.**
- An estimated 44 deaths are related to endometrial cancer each year.**
